3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4 This Act may be cited as the "Military and Edu
5 cational Data Integration Act".
6 SEC. 2. DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE PROCESS FOR SHARIN
7 MILITARY SERVICE DATA WITH STATES.

(a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

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1	(1) LOCAL EDUCATIONAL AGENCY.—The term
2	"local educational agency" has the meaning given
3	the term in section 8101 of the Elementary and Sec-
4	ondary Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 7801).
5	(2) SECONDARY SCHOOL.—The term "sec-
6	ondary school" has the meaning given the term in
7	section 8101 of the Elementary and Secondary Edu-
8	cation Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 7801).
9	(3) State educational agency.—The term
10	"State educational agency" has the meaning given
11	the term in section 8101 of the Elementary and Sec-
12	ondary Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 7801).
13	(b) Data Sharing Process.—
14	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Defense, in
15	consultation with the Secretary of Education, State
16	educational agencies, local educational agencies,
17	military leaders, and other experts in student data
18	and privacy shall, not later than 18 months after the
19	date of enactment of this Act, develop and imple-
20	ment a secure, data sharing process that enables
21	State educational agencies to, on a not less than an-
22	nual basis—
23	(A) access data elements described in para-
24	graph (2) maintained by the Secretary of De-

1	fense related to each such State's high school
2	graduates; and
3	(B) integrate data elements described in
4	paragraph (2) maintained by the Secretary of
5	Defense related to each such State's high school
6	graduates into—
7	(i) such State's statewide longitudinal
8	data system; or
9	(ii) an alternate data system operated
10	by such State.
11	(2) Data elements.—The data elements de-
12	scribed in this paragraph shall include information,
13	updated not less than annually, regarding the fol-
14	lowing:
15	(A) The military service of officers and en-
16	listed personnel, disaggregated by State of sec-
17	ondary school graduation (or most recent sec-
18	ondary school attendance before enlistment or
19	accession), including the following:
20	(i) The highest level of education at-
21	tained by the service member.
22	(ii) The name and location of the
23	school that provided the education ref-
24	erenced in clause (i).

1	(iii) The name and location of the sec-
2	ondary school from which the service mem-
3	ber graduated (if different than the infor-
4	mation provided under clause (ii)) (or most
5	recently attended if the service member did
6	not graduate).
7	(iv) The service member's score on the
8	Armed Forces Qualification Test.
9	(v) The date of accession into the
10	Armed Forces by the service member.
11	(vi) The military service of the service
12	member.
13	(vii) The current rank of the service
14	member.
15	(viii) The area of expertise or military
16	occupational specialty (MOS) of the service
17	member.
18	(ix) The date of separation from the
19	Armed Forces by the service member.
20	(x) Any other information deemed rel-
21	evant by the Secretary of Defense.
22	(B) Information with respect to individuals
23	who applied for military service (as officers or
24	enlisted personnel, disaggregated by State of
25	secondary school graduation (or most recent

secondary school attendance before enlistment
or accession)), including the following:
(i) The highest level of education at-
tained by the individual.
(ii) The name and location of the
school that provided the education ref-
erenced in clause (i).
(iii) The name and location of the sec-
ondary school from which the individual
graduated (if different than the informa-
tion provided under clause (ii)) (or most
recently attended if the individual did not
graduate).
(iv) The individual's score on the
Armed Forces Qualification Test.
(3) Privacy.—The Secretary of Defense shall
carry out the secure data sharing process required
under paragraph (1) in a manner that protects indi-
vidual privacy and data security, in accordance with
applicable Federal, State, and local privacy laws.
The data collected pursuant to this subsection shall
be collected and maintained in an anonymous for-
mat.
